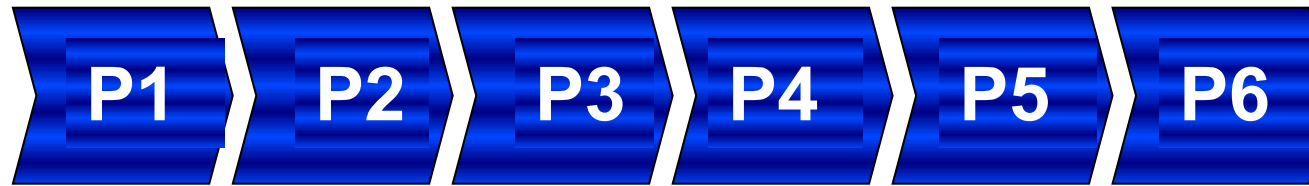

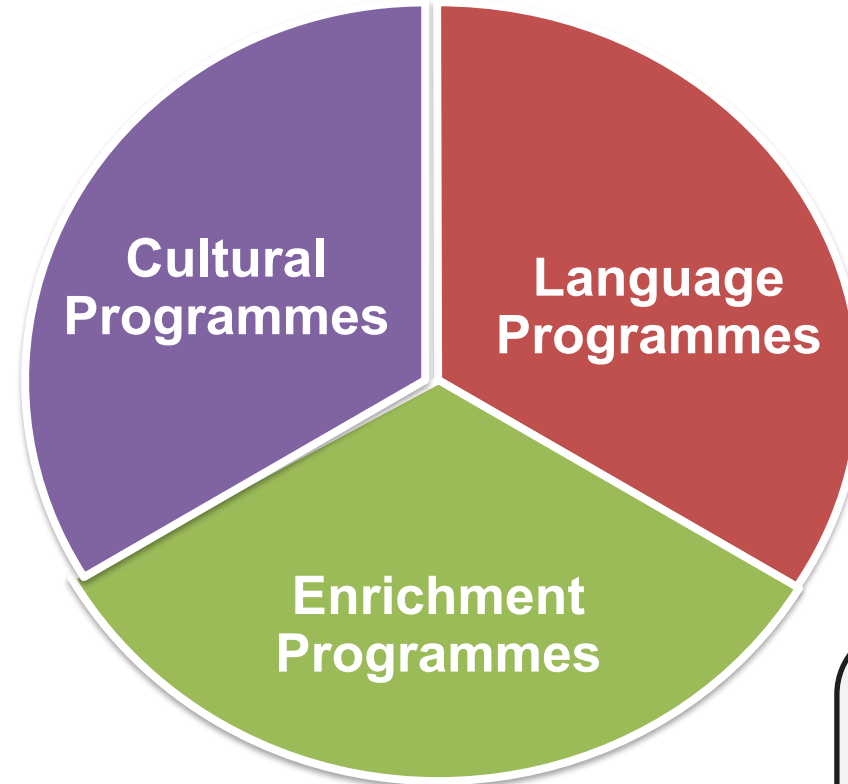

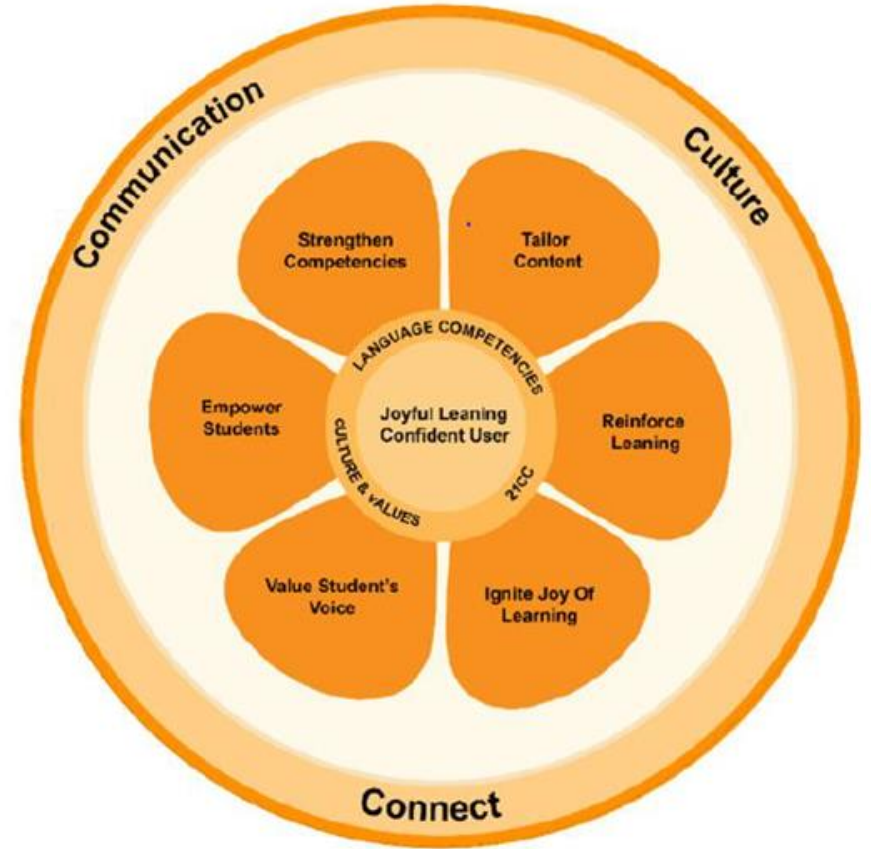

1. The 2024 New Primary MTL Curriculum which will be implemented next year starting with Primary 1, will **build on the strengths of the 2015 curriculum.**
2. The new curriculum will place greater focus on helping students to **experience the joy of learning MTL**, so as to motivate them to like and learn MTL for life.



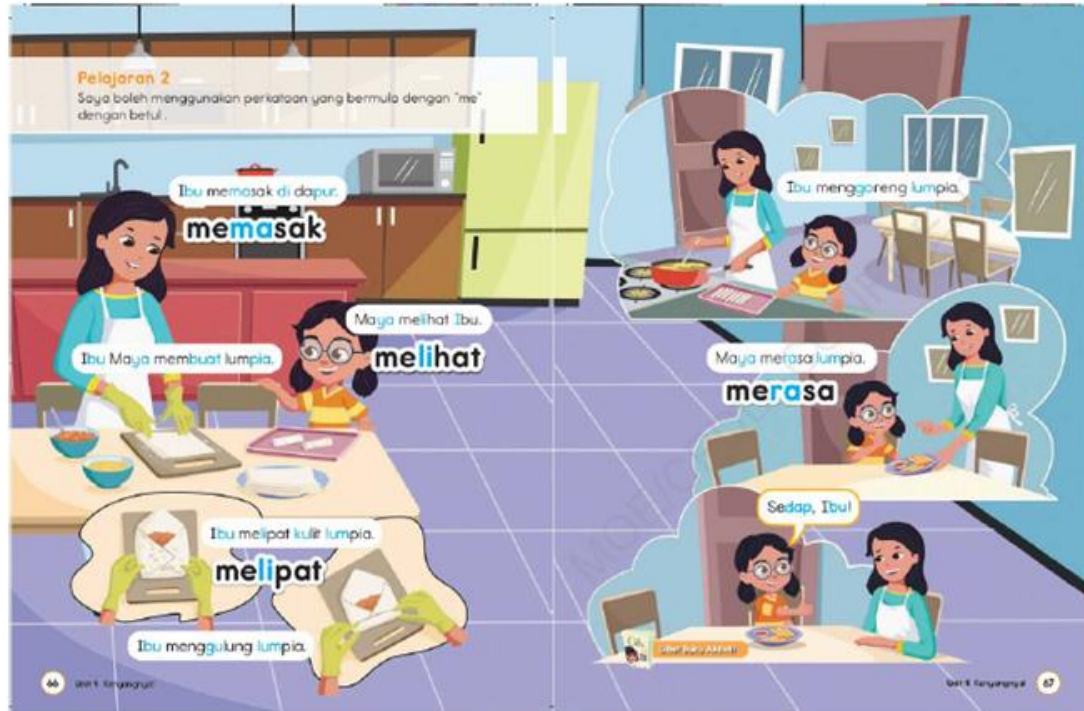

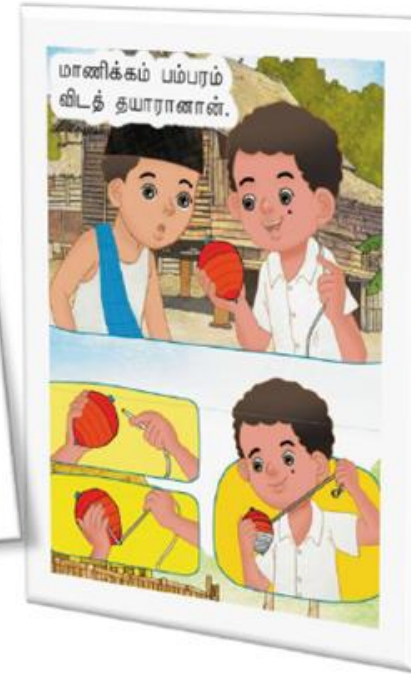

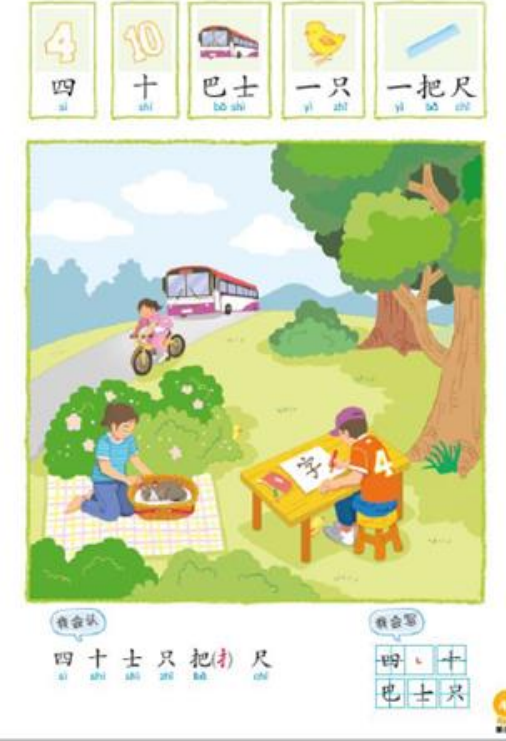
Key Feature #2

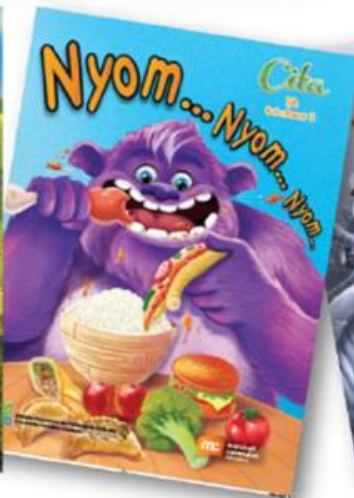

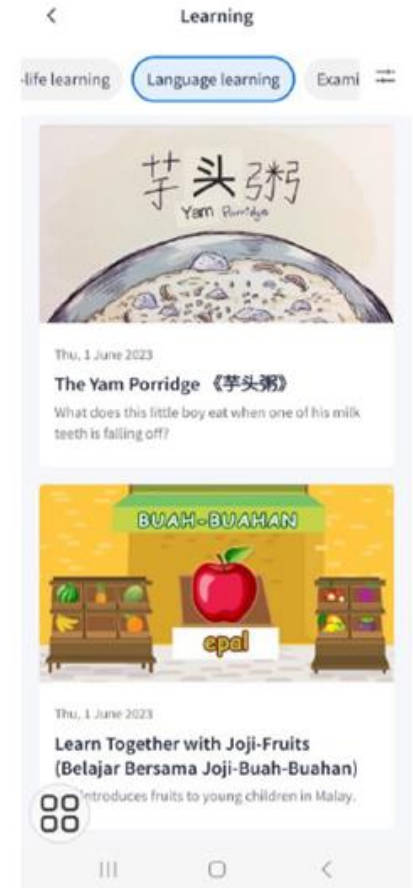

MTL Small Readers



- Specially designed for P1 students
- Children can recognise and read most content
- Builds confidence while introducing new vocabulary
- Available in physical and digital formats (SLS)



Phases of Reading

Before Reading	During Reading	After Reading
Look at the book cover together and ask "what do you think this story is about?"	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read with expression• Don't stop for every unknown word• Let the story flow	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• "What was your favourite part/character?"• Use post-reading activities as family bonding time



Don't interrupt the magic



DON'TS

Don't

- ✗ Stop to spell/write/ask meaning of every new word
- ✗ Turn reading into a spelling test
- ✗ Correct every mispronunciation

Do

- ✓ Focus on story enjoyment
- ✓ Explain words simply if asked
- ✓ Celebrate understanding, not perfection



DO'S

Beyond Books



- Reading is like a “seated adventure”
- Learning continues after closing the book
- Daily conversations reinforce new vocabulary



Support without Fluency

Even if you're not fluent in MTL, you can:

- **Create a special reading corner**
- **Schedule family reading time**
- **Visit public libraries together**
- **Show enthusiasm for MTL books**



Turn Routine into Learning

During meals	"Tell me about your story character"
In the car/bus	"What new words did you learn today?"
At bedtime	"Which character would you befriend?"
Doing chores	"This reminds me of your story..."



Digital Support for Parents

- SLS digital readers with read-aloud function
- Learn alongside your child
- Perfect for non-fluent parents
- Available 24/7 for flexible reading time

Common Parent Concerns

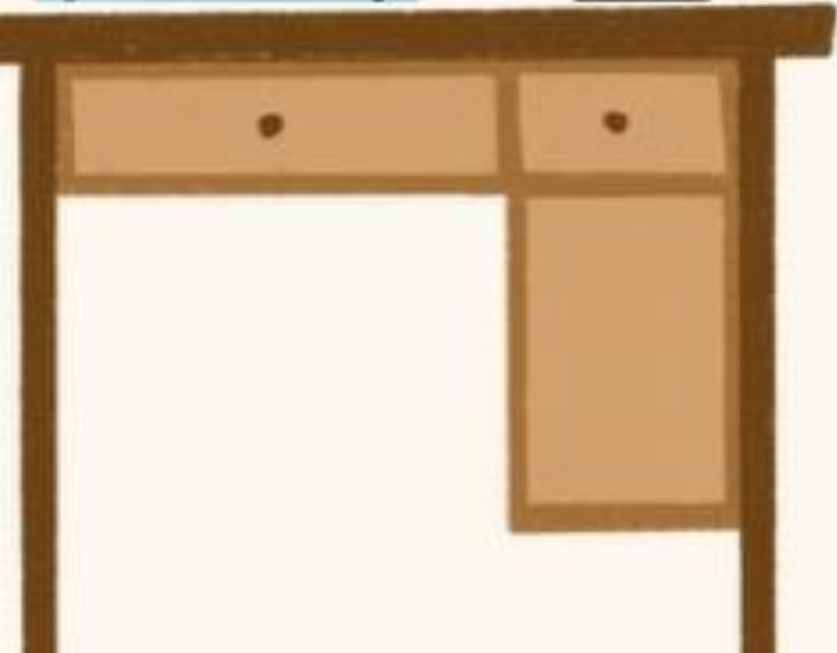
My child can't read independently yet

Weekly Routine



Weekdays

- Read small readers together for 10 mins
- Child “reads” to you

Weekends

- Complete reading passport activities
- Visit the public library

Building Sustainable Reading Habits

- Consistency matters more than perfection
- Celebrate small wins with stickers
- Let your child choose some books independently
- Connect reading to family traditions/routines



Your **MTL** SOAR Action Plan @ home

Spark Interest	Choose engaging stories, ask “what if” questions
Open Minds	Expose to new vocabulary beyond spelling level
Appreciate Roots	Use MTL stories to connect with culture and heritage
Rise as Readers	Celebrate progress, not perfection
